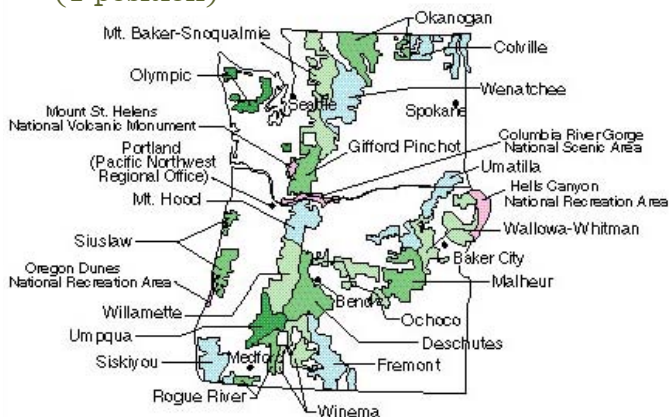
If you'd like a rewarding career working as a Wildland Firefighter for the US Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management, the Wildland Firefighter Apprenticeship Program could be for you!

The Wildland Firefighter Apprenticeship Program is an accredited, educational program designed to enhance and develop future Fire and Aviation Managers. The intent of the Program is to take a career entry firefighter and provide education, training and paid work experience over a 24 to 48 month period. Upon successful completion of all the requirements of the Apprenticeship Program, the apprentice will reach journey-level status as a wildland firefighter and receive a career-conditional (permanent) appointment to a Forestry Technician (Senior Firefighter) GS-0462-05.

The Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management offer positions at 12 different geographic areas... opportunities exist to be considered for up to 5 different locations. If you are interested, check out what geographic areas might be the best fit for you!

Check out these requirements to see if you are eligible for the Wildland Firefighter Apprentice program:

- A US citizen or National (resident of American Samoa or Swains Island).
- At least 18 years of age at time of appointment.
- Maximum entry age is 36.
- Applicants must possess and maintain a valid State driver's license through duration of program.

How To Apply

You will need the following for a complete application:

- Resume or OF-612 application*
- College Transcripts if applicable. (They must be legible transcripts which indicate courses taken and degrees conferred)
- Location Preference Form **
- Additional forms needed for Veterans Preference or Disability, if applicable
