




nearly 6,000 acres






Fire Spread



Florida June 6, 1998






Florida July 4, 1998




Sizzling Summer

- PM10 values were highest 6/22 - 7/4




PM10 from Florida Fires




PM10 from Florida Fires

June 22, 1998 PM10 Concentrations





June 28, 1998 PM10 Concentrations




PM10 Independence Day




Increasing Fires as Time Passed




Florida Fires, June 29th





Burn Coverage During Elevated Ozone
